The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (Specialized) program was established for the following reasons: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Meeting Labor Market Needs: Studies on labor market needs among beneficiaries

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	<p>of nursing services revealed that nursing graduates must possess specialized skills to serve and meet community needs. The program was designed to equip graduates to deliver high-quality nursing care, focusing on a nursing specialty chosen by the student based on societal demands.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shortage of Specialized Nurses: There is a significant shortage of specialized nurses in various clinical and educational fields, impacting the quality of education and practice. • Shortage of Professional Nurses: A severe lack of professional nurses (graduates of nursing colleges) has resulted in a deficit of specialized nurses in fields such as critical and emergency care, maternity and women’s health nursing, oncology nursing, pediatric care, and other specialized branches of nursing. • Implementation of International Recommendations: The International Council of Nurses recommends that all nursing services in healthcare institutions be managed by qualified nursing specialists. Furthermore, basic, post-basic, and specialized nursing education programs should be conducted by professionally and pedagogically qualified specialist nurses. <p>Generally, the program provides students with knowledge, skills, and competencies to work in both general and specialized nursing fields after graduation. It fosters creativity and encourages the use of evidence-based research in nursing practice to meet patient needs and enhance healthcare services for the community.</p>

Pass the medical examinations required. 6. International students must meet the same general admission conditions as Egyptian counterparts, following the rules set by the Supreme Council of Universities. 7. Students holding diplomas from technical institutes for nursing or health (nursing stream) are accepted provided: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ They enroll in the first level of study. ○ They present proof of good conduct and behavior. ○ The applicant's age does not exceed 25 years. ○ They achieve a minimum grade of 75% (the minimum admission score for technical nursing certifications).

The student must hold a secondary school certificate in the Science stream or an equivalent qualification, according to the rules and regulations set by the Supreme Council of Universities. 2. Achieve the minimum admission score for the nursing colleges in the year of obtaining the secondary certificate and in compliance with university regulations: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Minimum score for 2023: 80.6% ○ Minimum score for 2022: 69.69% ○ For the 2024 intake, admission scores will be determined upon the announcement of



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	the year's nursing faculty entry requirements.
Admission for Students with Non-Egyptian Secondary Certificates (Arab or Foreign)	International students must meet the same general admission conditions as Egyptian counterparts, following the rules set by the Supreme Council of Universities.
